



Guidelines Master's Exam "Chemistry" and "Chemistry & Business Studies"

Details of the Master's exam:

The oral Master's exam is multidisciplinary and takes place after completion of the Master's thesis. **It includes fundamental chemical knowledge of the Bachelor as well as advanced topics.** Students demonstrate their ability to understand, explain and critically discuss scientific concepts.

The exam lasts 60 minutes and is conducted by the group leader of the Department of Chemistry (DoC) who was responsible for the Master's thesis and a lecturer from the DoC who was not involved in the thesis project.

After submission of the Master's thesis, a preparation period of at least 4-6 weeks is recommended for the exam.

Organization of exam:

No later than upon submission of the Master's thesis, students (together with the DoC group leader responsible for the Master's thesis) select a second examiner for the Master's exam and agree on a date for the exam with their examiners. This date must be entered into the StudentAdmin system. Organizational and content-related details regarding the exam are agreed and arranged directly between the student and the examiners.

As stipulated in the regulations, the Master's exam takes place on a different day than the defense of the Master's thesis.
